Bobby Dickson's Comedy Corner



"Memories of Performing at the Friedrichstadt-Palast" (Part 1)

The Friedrichstadt-Palast is a huge theater in Berlin. It has a

seating capacity of 1,895 and its stage of 2,854 square meters (30,720 sq ft) is the largest in the world.

I performed in this former East German theater many times over 30+ years...first in the original Palast theatre, then in a tour of East German theaters with the Palast dancers while a new theatre was being built, and finally in the new Palast theatre itself. Friedrichstadt-Palast is the most professional place I have ever had the pleasure of performing.

Simply the best.



The Friedrichstadt-Palast dancers consist of about 40 ladies and 20 men...all classically trained in ballet, tap, modern, jazz - - you name it - - they are true professionals. They are as famous in Europe as the Radio City Rockette dancers are in America...or maybe the Dallas Cowboy cheerleaders is a better example, nowadays!



Altogether, the ladies create one of the world's longest chorus lines (which you can enjoy by clicking on the links at the end of this article).

In this particular show, I worked with a group of 12 Romanian gymnasts. They were a wonderful group of young people who after the first couple of days, 'adopted' my wife Anoushka and me.

For example, some of the fellows slept (*read: passed out*) in our apartment many times. And the girls would often invite us to their place and cooked traditional Romanian food for us.

Whenever the guys discussed their routines, they'd say something like, "I did a Yamashita vault." At which point I'd butt in with, "I taught Yamashita English when he lived with me."

Or they'd say," I dismounted with a Tsukahara." To which I casually replied, "I competed with Tsukahara, in fact, he gave me his warm-up suit." The same dialog went on for a couple of other famous gymnasts.

Finally, one of the guys got suspicious, so he phoned his coach in Romania and told him, "We have an American fellow here who says that he was a gymnast and even competed against... (repeating the names I mentioned)."

His coach asked what my name was and when he heard it, he exclaimed, "Bobby Dickson? Of course, I've heard about Bobby Dickson!"

As an apology for doubting me, the next time that gymnast went home he brought back for me a 1½ liter bottle of palincă (Transylvanian Moonshine) that his grandfather distilled in his basement.

Smooooooooooth!!!


How did you get started in acrobatic sports? My Aunt was an acrobat and introduced me to acrobatics when I was a little over 3 years old. I absolutely loved it!


## In what ways have your experiences in your sport helped you in your life today?
